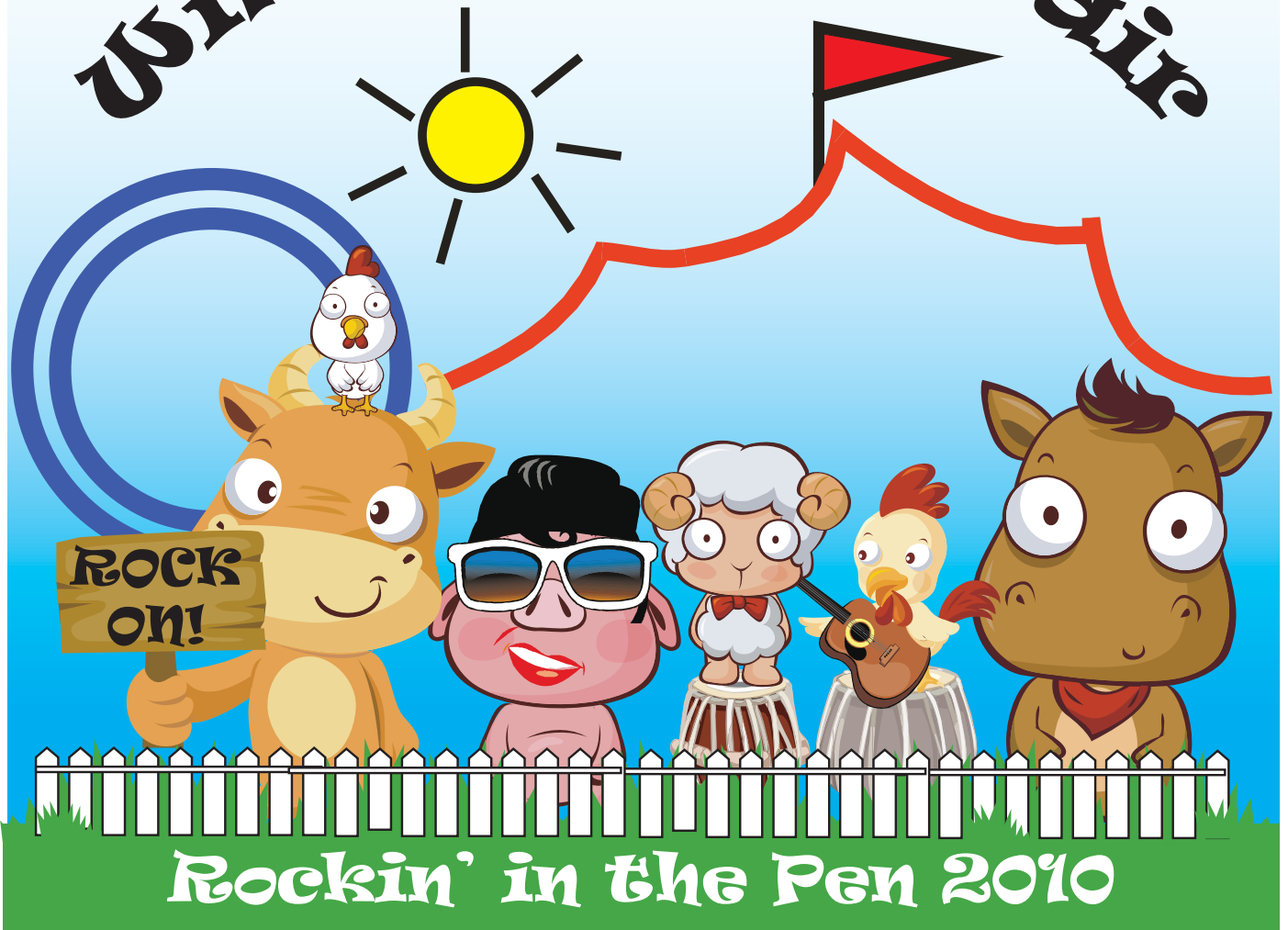

Youth and Adults: Sunday, September 19th – 1:00 – 4:00 PM

Prepared Foods and Cut Flowers/Arrangements ONLY: Monday, September 20th – 9:00 – 11:00 AM

No Youth or Adult items will be accepted for judging after 4:00 PM, Sunday

Prepared Foods and Cut Flowers/Arrangement entries accepted on Monday, September 20th – 9:00 – 11:00 AM

Judging results will not be available until after 4:00 PM Tuesday, September 21st

PICK UP EXHIBITS & PREMIUMS:

Monday, September 27th: 3:00 – 6:00 PM ONLY

In the event of an emergency when exhibits cannot be picked up on September 27th, you will need to make arrangements to do so on September 28th. After September 28th, entries become property of the fair.

RULES: (PLEASE READ AND FOLLOW ALL RULES)

1. No peddling, hawking, vending or distributing of advertising matter or shows will be permitted on the fairgrounds including parking area except by license from Fair Management.
2. Drunkenness, quarreling or the use of profane or obscene language will not be permitted on the grounds. The Fair reserves the right to expel any objectionable person from the fairgrounds without refund of entry fees or admission.
3. Reasonable space will be allowed to all exhibitors up to the capacity of the buildings, grounds, shelves and showcases.
4. Fair management will appoint judges who shall award the premiums as they interpret the rules.
5. Exhibitors please note carefully any special rules for each department or category and comply with same.
6. Exhibits submitted after Sunday, September 19th, (prepared foods and cut flowers/arrangements, Sept. 20), are not eligible for judging and premiums, but may be displayed if the Exhibit Director deems the exhibit appropriate.
7. No article or animal shall be entitled to space until proper entry has been made.
8. Exhibitor's business cards, pamphlets, etc, may be distributed only after judging is complete.
9. No exhibits shipped collect to the Fair will be accepted.
10. Exhibits must remain in place until Monday, September 27th. Early pick-up will result in forfeiture of premium.
11. Only one person will be admitted to the fair per ticket.
12. All exhibitors agree to comply with the rules of Wilson County American Legion Fair.
13. Fair management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit, concession or display that may be falsely entered or may be deemed unsuitable.
14. Exhibitor Passes: Any exhibitor entering at least 10 items for exhibit at the Fair will receive one (1) free admission to the fair (not one ticket for each 10 items entered). Commercial Exhibitors and Vendors will be issued limited passes from the Fair Office.

SPECIAL CATEGORIES:

Premier Exhibitor – Requirements

- Exhibitor will display at least five (5) quality items in at least three (3) different fair departments.
- Exhibitors will complete a Premier Exhibitor application, list items exhibited and reasons why they should be named a Premier Exhibitor.
- One Premier Exhibitor will be awarded a \$25.00 prize and special recognition annually.
- Premier Exhibitor application must be submitted by 4:00 PM, Sunday September 19, 2010.

FOOD PRESERVATION RULES:

All entries must have been prepared by the exhibitor within the last year. Entries in these classes should be shown in quart or pint jars. (Only Kerr, Ball, & Mason canning jars accepted). Premiums will not be awarded unless entries are of good quality. Fruits and tomatoes should be processed in boiling water bath. Low-acid vegetables should be processed in steam pressure canner.

PREPARED FOODS RULES:

Prepared food items must be exhibited on non-returnable plates. The Fair is not responsible for returning plates. All articles must be entered in the name of the preparer. Prepared food items entered will become the property of Wilson County Fair. Items will be photographed after judging for display during Fair. Prepared food items will be sold at auction on Tuesday evening, Sept. 21st, at 8:30pm. Proceeds will benefit the Wilson Crisis Center of Wilson. Winning bidder may keep the food or donate it to the Wilson Crisis Center. Decorated Cakes – would prefer edible cakes but will accept form.
